



Charter of commitment to the CE Mark

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The Construction Product Regulation (CPR) published in April 2011 stipulates that in order to place a construction product on the European Union market, the manufacturer must draw up a declaration of performance and affix the CE mark to the product in question. As a result of this regulation, two standards directly affect our products:

- NF EN 14566+A1 Mechanical fasteners for gypsum plasterboard
- NF EN 14592 Timber structures – Dowel-type fasteners - requirements

The main aim of these standards is to provide values that can be used in calculations by designers (design offices, architects, project managers, etc.). These values are available on our product labels and in every declaration of performance on our website.

We have chosen to mark ranges of products packaged in appropriate packaging, which are likely to be used in load-bearing wooden structures that can be calculated by designers. Secondly, product ranges designed for use in plasterboard fixings :

CE marking, which attests to a product's conformity, is the visible consequence of an overall process involving conformity assessment in the broadest sense:

- Initial Type Testing (ITT)
- Factory Production Control (FPC)
- Déclaration of Performance (DoP)

By drawing up the declaration of performance and affixing the CE mark, we assume responsibility for the conformity of our products with the declared performance.

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
